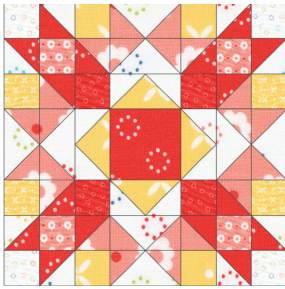

Beginner Friendly

Techniques Used: 8 at a time HST, No waste flying geese

Preferred Quilters Select Tools: 3 ½" square QS ruler

HST- Half Square Triangles

RST- Right Sides together

Fabric Requirements

Fabric	Cuts
Light Fabric A (white)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• (4) 3 ½" squares• (1) 8" square• (2) 7 ½" squares• (4) 4" squares
Dark Fabric B (red)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• (2) 8" squares• (4) 3 ½" squares• (1) 6 ½" square
Light Fabric C (yellow)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• (8) 3 ½" squares• (1) 7 ½" square
Light Fabric D (pink)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• (8) 4" squares• (4) 3 ½" squares• (1) 8" square

Things to keep in mind

This block has a lot of seams. Pressing all of your seams open will help reduce bulk in the intersections and make sewing more enjoyable.

Your cuts are intentionally oversized to allow for trimming. Don't worry if something sews out a bit "wonky", there is room to trim it up straight.

Trimming is your friend! You'll be amazed at how well this goes together if you trim after each step.

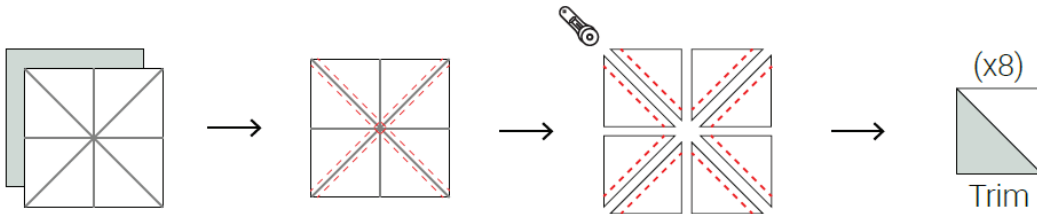
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Make 8 at a time Half Square Triangle Units

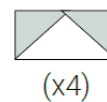
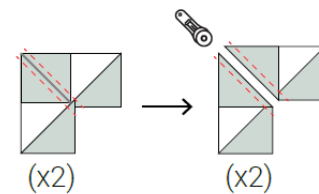
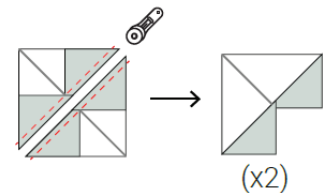
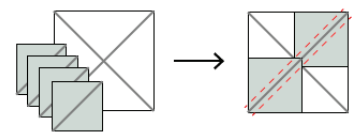
Place (1) fabric B 8" square and (1) fabric A 8" square RST and mark two diagonal lines and two perpendicular lines through the center. Then sew a 1/4" away from both sides of each diagonal line (diagonal lines only). Then cut on each of the lines you drew.

Open up your HSTs and press the seams to one side. Trim HSTs to 3 1/2". You will have 8 A/B HST units. Repeat with (1) fabric B 8" square and (1) fabric D 8" square for a total of 8 B/D HST units.



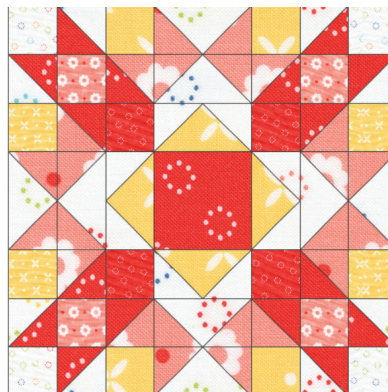
Make No Waste Flying Geese

1. Draw two diagonal lines on the front of your 7 1/2" fabric A square and one diagonal line on the backs of (4) fabric D 4" squares. Align two of the fabric D squares with the diagonal line of the fabric A square and its corners. Sew 1/4" on either side of this line.
2. Cut on the line and press the seams open. Then add the remaining fabric D squares on each of the remaining diagonal lines of the fabric fabric A square.
3. Sew on either side of the line and cut. You will have 4 flying geese. Trim each to 3 1/2" x 6 1/2".
4. Repeat with remaining 7 1/2" fabric A fabric D 4" squares and 7 1/2" fabric C square and (4) 4" fabric A squares until you have a total of 8 A/D flying geese units and 4 C/A flying geese units.



Construct Your Shawnee Block

Using the below placement chart, arrange your remaining squares with flying geese and HST units with your 3 1/2" squares into 8 rows. Then sew rows together. Block finishes at 24 1/2" square.
