

Recommended Rulers & Notions:

- Quilters Select 6.5" x 12" Non-Slip ruler
- Quilters Select 3"x12" Non-Slip Ruler
- Quilters Select Self Erase Marker

Cutting:

Fabric A: Cut 2:	5 1/2" Squares
Fabric B: Cut 1:	5 1/2" Square
Cut 4:	2 1/2" Squares
Cut 2:	4" Squares
Fabric C: Cut 1 :	4 1/2" Square
Fabric D: Cut 4:	2 1/2" Squares
Fabric E: Cut 2	4" Squares
Fabric F: Cut 1	5 1/2" Square

Block Skill Level

Confident Beginner Unfinished block: 12.5" x 12.5"


Techniques used:

"Speed Stitch" construction. *For best results prepare fabrics with starch prior to cutting.*

<u>Read through all instructions before beginning.</u> HST =Half Square Triangle QST= Quarter Square Triangle RST= Right Sides Together

Fabric Selection:

- Construction of HST and QST units in this block use "Speed Stitch" techniques that are best used with scatter prints, solids or other non-directional fabrics.
- The center unit and small red squares in the illustration are perfect for fussy cut fabrics.











Speed Stitch: Four at a Time HST

- Place Fabric B and Fabric E 4" squares right sides together.
- Stitch around all 4 edges.
- Cut units from corner to corner in both directions.
- Open each resulting half-square unit. Press seam allowance open; trim unit to 2 1/2".
- Repeat for remaining Fabric B and Fabric E 4" squares for a total of 8 half square units.




Speed Stitch: Two at a Time> Quarter Square Triangle Units


- Place Fabric F and Fabric A 5 1/2" squares right sides together.
- Draw line diagonally from corner to corner.
- Stitch 1/4" away one each side of the drawn line.
- Cut along the line to separate the two units. (Segment 1) Press seam open.




Fabric F + A

Cut along marked line.



Press open, do not trim. Makes 2.

• Repeat with Fabric A and Fabric B 5 1/2" squares. (Segment 2)








Speed Stitch: Two at a Time> Quarter Square Triangle Units cont.

- Place a Segment 1 unit right sides together over a Segment 2 unit; opposing colors together and seam lines aligned.
- Draw line diagonally from corner to corner, intersecting the seam line. •
- Stitch 1/4'' away one each side of the drawn line. •
- Cut along the line to separate the two units. Press seams open and trim unit to $4 \frac{1}{2''}$.




Cut along marked line. Open, press and trim to 4 1/2" square.

Repeat with remaining Segment 1 & 2 units for a total of four Quarter Square Triangle units.


Put it All Together:

- Make 4:
 - Join Fabric B 2 1/2" square to HST unit. ٠
 - Join Fabric D 2 1/2" square to HST unit.
 - Join the segments together to form 4-patch unit.














Put it All Together: cont.

- Row 1: Join 4 patch unit + QST + 4 patch unit.
- Row 2: Join QST+ Fabric C + QST.
- Row 3: Join 4 patch unit + QST + 4 patch unit.



• Join Rows 1 + 2 + 3 to complete the block.
