The Design N Stitch block is a 12" x 12" finished block. The pattern demonstrated is for one block.

Fabric Sample Colors	Yardage
Fabric A	1/8 yard or scraps can be used.
Fabric B	1/4 yard or Fat Quarter
Fabric C	1/4 yard or scraps can be used or at least 6"x6" scraps needed
Fabric D	1/8 yard or scraps can be used.
Fabric E	1/4 yard or scraps can be used or at least 6"x6" scraps needed

Fabric listed for 1 block. **Finished Size:** 12" x 12"

Cutting ChartRead all instructions prior to cutting fabric.

Notions: Standard foot, coordinating thread, rotary cutter, cutting mat, ruler, scissors, clips or pins, 80/12 needle.

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
Fabric Yardage Required:

**More fabric may be required if using directional fabric or fussy cutting. Adjust amounts as needed.


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
Fabric Color Key

Each color is identified with letters.



Unit Piecing Sequence Make 2 units of each color layout.









- Read through all of the directions prior to cutting and piecing the fabric. All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{2}$ unless otherwise stated.
- Press seams to one side or open.
- Printing a color copy will be helpful when aligning pieces and blocks
- Refer to the color in the yardage and sample diagram.

**Gray indicates the back side or wrong side of the fabric.




Helpful Sewing Terms:

- RST- Right Sides Together WST- Wrong Sides Together

Forming the Four 1-2 Main Units:

Keep page 2 diagrams close by for Color and Sequence reference.


- 1. Take one **Fabric B:** 5 ¾" square and place it right side up(Figure A).
- 2. Put one **Fabric C**: 5 ½" square right side down on the top lower right side of the square and match the corners(Figure B).
- 3. On the wrong side of the 5 ½" square fabric, draw a diagonal line from the top right corner to the bottom left corner of the square (Figure B).
- 4. Sew on the drawn line.
- 5. Trim a 1/4" seam allowance (Figure C). Press toward the corner (Figure D). Repeat steps 1-4 with the other three 5 3/4" squares and 5 1/2" squares. Four 1-2 units are formed.






Forming the four 1-2-3 Units:

- 1. Take one 1-2 unit from the previous step and place it right side up (Figure I).
- 2. Put one **Fabric A:** 3" square RST on the top left side of the square and matching the corners (Figure J). Use alternate colors for each unit as shown in the example.
- 3. On the wrong side of the 3" square of fabric, draw a diagonal line across the square from right to left (Figure J).
- 4. Sew on the drawn line.
- 5. Trim a ½" seam allowance (Figure K). Press toward the corner (Figure L). Repeat steps 1-5 for the other three 1-2 units. The 1-2-3 units are formed.



Forming the four 1-2-3-4 Units:

- 1. Take one 1-2-3 unit from the previous step and place it right side up (Figure M).
- 2. Put one **Fabric C:** 1 ½" square RST on the top corner of the left triangle (Figure M).
- 3. On the wrong side of the 1 ½" square fabric, draw a diagonal line across the square from right to left (Figure N).
- 4. Sew on the drawn line.
- 5. Trim a ¼" seam allowance (Figure O). Press toward the corner (Figure P). Repeat steps 1-5 for the other three 1-2-3 unit squares by alternating the fabric colors as shown in the example. The 1-2-3-4 units are formed.








Adding the Divider Strips to the Formed Unit 1-2-3-4:


- 1. Take one1-2-3-4 unit from the previous step and place it right side up (Figure Q).
- 2. Turn the unit so that piecing unit 2 is facing the bottom right corner.
- 3. Put one **Fabric B:** 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle RST along the bottom edge of the large square (Figure R). A portion of the rectangle will stick out beyond the square.
- 4. With RST, sew along the bottom edge to attach the first divider strip(Figure R).
- 5. Press the divider strip away from the unit and trim off the excess (Figure S).
- 6. Take the second **Fabric B:1** ¼" x 6 ½" rectangle with RST over the right side of the unit (Figure U). Sew along the right side edge to attach the second divider strip. Press away from the unit(Figure V). Repeat steps 1-5 for the other four unit squares. Unit 1-2-3-4-5-6 are formed.





Forming the four 1-2-3-4-5-6-7 Units:


- 1. Take one 1-2-3-4-5-6 unit from the previous step and place it right side up (Figure W).
- 2. Put one **Fabric D:** 3" square RST on the top left side of the square and matching the corners(Figure X). Use alternate colors for each unit as shown in the example.
- 3. On the wrong side of the 3" square of fabric, draw a diagonal line across the square from right to left (Figure X).
- 4. Sew on the drawn line.
- 5. Trim a ¼" seam allowance (Figure Y). Press toward the corner (Figure Z). Repeat steps 1-5 for the other three 1-2-3-4-5-6 units by alternating fabric colors as shown in the example. The 1-2-3-4-5-6-7 units are formed.



Completing the four 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8 Units:

- 1. Take one1-2-3-4-5-6-7 unit from the previous step and place it right side up (Figure AA).
- 2. Put one **Fabric A:** 1½" square RST on the bottom corner of the large triangle (Figure BB).
- 3. On the wrong side of the 1 ½" square fabric, draw a diagonal line across the square from left to right (Figure BB).
- 4. Sew on the drawn line.
- 5. Trim a ¼" seam allowance (Figure CC). Press toward the corner (Figure DD). Repeat steps 1-5 for the other three 1-2-3-4-5-6-7 unit squares by alternating the fabric colors as shown in the example. The 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8 units are formed. The units are complete.

Note: There are two units with the same fabric combination and it alternates for the other two units when all four units are completed.






Forming Rows 1 and 2

1. Lay out units to form each row as shown in the example below. Sew each unit with RST in a row with a ¼" seam allowance and press each seam.















1. Sew row 1 to row 2 with RST(Figure A). Figure B shows the completed block.








