Technique Featured:

- Flying Geese Units
 - The technique shown below uses a stitch and trim method for more precise units & lends itself well to working with directional fabrics.

Pro-Tips:

- Read through all instructions before beginning.
- Seam Allowance= 1/4"

Flying Geese Units

Background Fabric: Cut (16) 4" x 7" rectangles


Fabric (B) Cut (16) 4" squares Fabric (C) Cut (16) 4" squares

- Solid or scatter prints: Mark the wrong side of each Fabric
 (B) square, on the diagonal from corner to corner.
- For <u>directional fabrics</u>:
 - Fold Fabric (B) squares in half (wrong sides together) to determine which half of the square is justified properly for the unit/unit location. (Note the placement of Fabric B on the Background Fabric) In this case the desired position of the bird is upright on the star leg. Press the fold.


Note: For better visibility, use a fabric marking pen to draw a line on the wrong side of the fabric, over the fold line.


- Place Fabric (B) and Background rectangle right sides together, marked line positioned as shown.
- Stitch on the marked line.


Note: Stitch from the center of the background to the top right corner for more accuracy.
















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- Trim 1/4" of away from stitching line.
- Press seam open.
- Repeat for all Fabric (B) / Background rectangles.




Remaining "Wings"

- Solid or scatter prints: Mark the wrong side of each Fabric (C) square, on the diagonal from corner to corner.
- For <u>directional fabrics</u>: Fold, press and mark as per Fabric (B) instructions.



- Stitch on the marked line.
 - Note: Stitch from the bottom corner to the center of the unit for more precision
- Trim 1/4" of away from stitching line.
- Press seam towards the background.
- Repeat for all Fabric (C) / Background rectangles.
- Trim each unit to 3 1/2" x 6 1/2".













Make 16 3 1/2" x 16"
