
<u>Technique Featured:</u>

Flying Geese

Technique shown uses Stitch & Trim (aka Stitch & Flip) method for more precise units. This method lends itself well to working with directional fabrics and fussy cutting.

Pro-Tips:

- Read through all instructions before beginning.
- Seam Allowance= 1/4"
- RST= Right sides together


Cutting Instructions:

Fabric (5) Cut (16) 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangles (referred to as the Center or Goose)

Fabric (2) Cut (32) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares (referred to as the Back ground or Wings)

Flying Geese Units

Draw a line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each Fabric (2) Square.



Fabric (2) 4 1/2" squares. Mark corner to corner on wrong side.





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- Place Fabric (2) and Fabric (5) right sides together, marked line positioned as show. Ensure raw edges align on all three edges.
- Stitch on the marked line.

Pro-tip: Shorten stitch length (1.5-1.8) to prevent the corner stitching from loosening.

> Note: Stitch from the center of the background to the top right corner for more accuracy.

Pro-tip/option: Create a bonus Half Square Triangle by marking a line 1/2" away from the stitched line toward the corner. Stitch. Cut between the stitched lines. Set aside the HST for another project.



- Press seam open.
- Repeat for each Fabric (5) rectangle.


Remaining "Wings"

- Place Fabric (2) unit on Fabric (5) RST as shown.
- Stitch <u>on</u> the marked line.


Note: Stitch from the bottom corner to the center of the unit for more precision.

Optional: Stitch bonus HST triangle.


- Trim 1/4" of away from stitching line.
- Press seam open.
- Repeat for remaining Fabrics (2) squares.




Make 16. 4 1/2" x 8 1/2"








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Join the Geese
