
Block 5

Techniques Featured:

- 4 At a Time Half-Square Triangles (HST)
- 3N1 Ruler Half-Square Triangles (optional)

Pro-Tips:

- Read through all instructions before beginning.
- Seam Allowance= 1/4"






Half Square Triangle Units (HST)


4-At a Time Method:

Fabric (2) Cut 2 each 6"x 6" Fabric (3) & (4) Cut 1 each 6" x 6"

- Place one Fabric 2 & 3 rights sides together.
- Stitch around all four edges.
- Cut units from corner to corner in both directions
- Open each resulting HST units. Press seam allowance to one side, trim unit to 3 1/2"
- Repeat with remaining Fabric (2) and (4).

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Ruler Method HST

Pro-Tip: The Ruler Method is perfect when working with directional fabrics, small scraps and to minimize fabric waste associated with trimming to size.

Fabric (2):	Cut 1	3 1/2" x 35" strip
Fabric (3):	Cut 1	3 1/2" x 16" strip
Fabric (4)	Cut 1	3 1/2" x 16" strip

- Straighten one short edge of Fabric (2). Position the blunt tip of the 3N1 Ruler along the top edge of the strip, trimmed short fabric edge aligned with the straight edge of the ruler, bottom of the strip at the 3 1/2" line. Cut.
- Rotate the ruler 180°, cut. Continue, cutting a total of 8 triangles.
- Repeat the cutting process with Fabric strips (3) and (4);
 cutting 4 triangles of each fabric.
- Position Fabric (2) & (3) triangles, right sides together, blunted corners aligned. Stitch.
- Make 4 HSTs. Each should measure 3 1/2".

• Repeat for Fabric (2) & Fabric (4) triangles. Make 4 HST units; each should measure 3 1/2".




Pro-Tip:

Once triangles are cut, use the blunt tip of the 3N1 ruler to clip the remaining corner of each triangle for more accurate piecing.



Position right sides together and stitch.



Make 4: 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Fabrics (2) & (3)



Make 4: 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Fabrics (2) & 4)





Assembling the Block


Fabric (1): Cut 1 3 1/2" x 24" strip

Fabric (3): Cut 2 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares


Cross cut Fabric (1) strip into six 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" units.


Pro-tip: Layout the units as shown to keep all HST correctly oriented for stitching.

- Stitch together Row 1 as illustrated.
- Stitch together Row 2 as illustrated.
- Stich together Row 3 as illustrated.
- Stitch together Row 4 as illustrated.



Join the rows together and press. Block should measure
 12 1/2" square for a 12" finish.
