

2025 - Whirligig Garden Stitch Along – Week 10

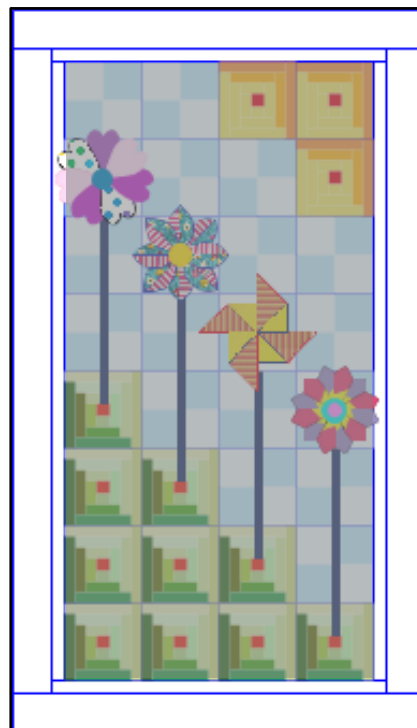
Borders –Horizontal Set

Borders frame the quilt and should complement the central design rather than overshadow it. When selecting fabrics, there are many things to take into consideration.

- *Style of your quilt: Does it have a traditional, modern, eclectic or whimsical design?*
- *Color: Choose colors that harmonize with the main body of the quilt.*
- *Contrast: If the quilt is busy, a simpler border may work best, whereas a plain quilt might benefit from a more elaborate border.*
- *Remember that there are no strict rules, trust your instincts and have fun experimenting with different options until you find the perfect border fabric for your quilt.*

Supplies Needed:

- Rotary cutter and mat
- 6 x 24 inch ruler
- Fabric (Large)
Inner border – ¼ yard
Outer border – 7/8 yard
- Fabric (Small)
Inner border – ¼ yard
Outer border – ½ yard



Pro Tip:

Before finalizing your decision, consider creating a mock-up or using software such as Quilters Select Design-N-Quilt to visualize how the chosen border will look with your quilt.

Cutting Borders - Large

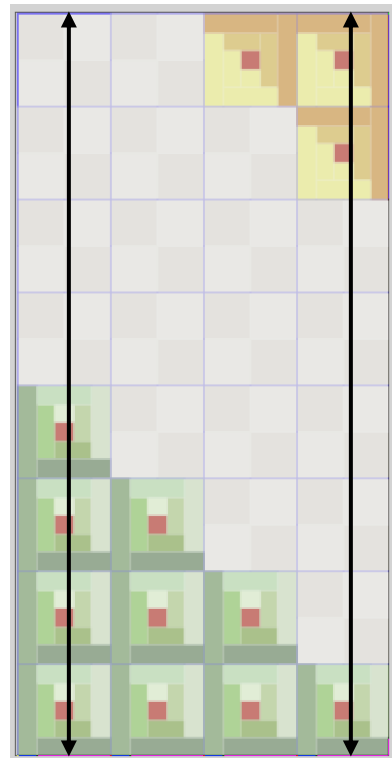
- Cut (6) fabric strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ x wof from inner border fabric
- Cut (6) fabric strips $4\frac{1}{2}$ x wof from outer border fabric

Cutting Borders - Small

- Cut (4) fabric strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ x wof from inner border fabric
- Cut (4) fabric strips $3\frac{1}{2}$ x wof from outer border fabric
- For the Large quilt, sew strips together to make one long strip

Note: Fabric requirements are correct and differ from those originally included on the "Just the Facts" sheet.

Note: Add Inner Borders to sides, then top & bottom. Repeat the same border process for outer borders.



Border – Sides

- Press the quilt top.
- Take two vertical measurements just a few inches in from the edges as shown.
- Average the two measurements to determine the length needed for the side borders.
- Cut two strips this length.
- Pin one strip to each side of the quilt rst making sure the top and bottom corners are aligned.
- Sew and press.

Border – Top and Bottom

- Take two horizontal measurements just a few inches in from the edges including the side borders.
- Average the two measurements to determine the length needed for the top and bottom borders.
- Cut two strips this length.
- Pin strips in place and aligning carefully.
- Sew and press.
