



Stitch along with the Official Quilters Select Group, to create a semi-controlled, improvisational mystery quilt!

The Mystery> Only Mother Nature knows where & when each fabric will be used!

The Improve> The spontaneity of the color placement & experimentation with a traditional unit (Dresden Wedge) lends itself to an improvisational experience.

Semi-control> And for those who like a little structure...the Temperature Quilt Guidelines keep the quilt from becoming chaos!



Getting started:

- Print out and review Temperature Quilt Data Tracker.
- Watch the following planning videos housed on The Official Quilters Select Facebook Group page. For the duration of the stitch along, these will live in the Featured Section.
 - Just the Facts
 - Weather Wedge Prep
- Determine the time range & location for data tracking. The instructions/weekly check-ins assume a one-year (current) quilt.
 - Current year
 - Birth year
 - Anniversary year
 - Home town
 - Favorite vacation destination
- Decide what you will track. For the Weather Wedge Quilt, daily hi/low and day of the week each month begins will be tracked.
 - Determine temperature range for each fabric and note on Data Tracker.
- *Note : If adding additional tracking, small amounts of fabric will be needed to represent the additional data. Print a second fabric tracker page to keep track of where each fabric in addition to high/low is used. Examples:*
 - Precipitation
 - Holidays
 - Special occasions
- Determine where you will gather data (ie: weather app/website). www.wunderground.com is one such site with a wealth of information.
- Gather fabrics> approx 1 yard each of 20 fabrics. Fabric suggestions discussed in Just the Facts video.
- The Quilters Select 18" Dresden Ruler will be used for the layout featured in the group . The Quilters Select Crystal Edition 4.5" x 18" is perfect for cutting the strip sets. Rulers available from Quilters Select Retailers or www.quiltersselect.com
- Approx finish based on the featured layout, including narrow sashing between month strips & BEFORE adding outer borders: approx 60" x 75".
