*Once again, a giant block has gobbled up a yummy mini block.....Gobble, gobble.*

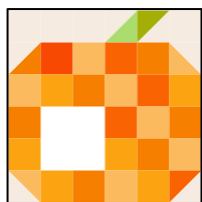
## Featured Techniques:

- Pattern reading skill building continues
- Layered cutting

*Pro Tip: Blocks are made from 2 ½ inch shapes unless stated otherwise and will measure 12 ½ square unfinished.*



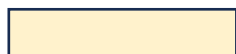
## Large Pumpkin



Precut shapes needed:  
2 ½ inch squares and hsts

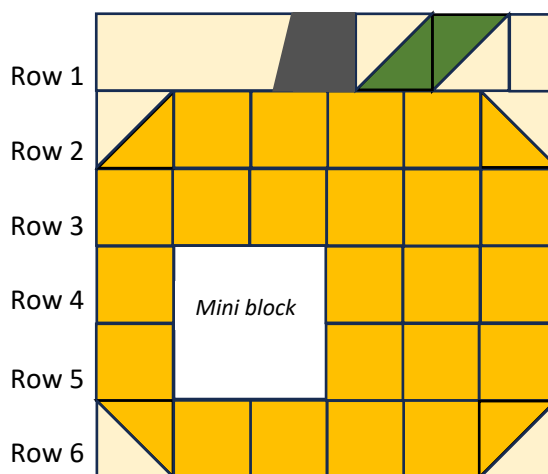


## Additional cutting



(1) 2 1/2" x 7 ½ " rectangle

Assorted fabric for (1) mini block of your choice



*Large pumpkin layout diagram 1*

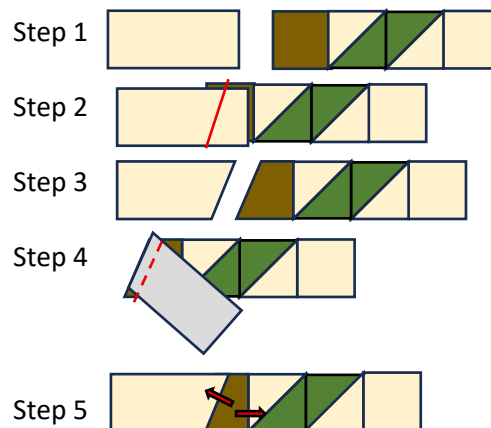
*Pattern reading tip: Before turning the page, study layout diagram 1. Can you develop a strategy for constructing the pumpkin body? It is similar to the large leaf layout, but how does it differ? Try grouping shapes into rectangular units*

# Quilt Along with QUILTERS SELECT®

## Row 1: Layer cutting technique

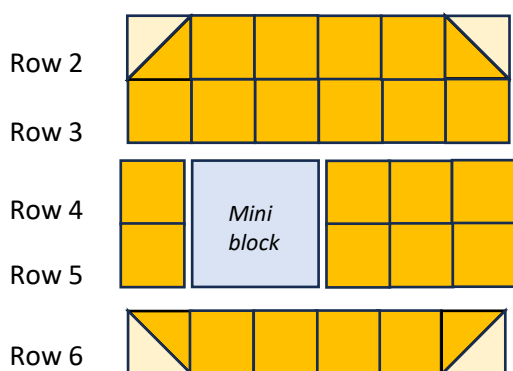
- Sew the last 4 shapes in Row 1 together
- Lay the remaining rectangle *right side up* covering the stem piece.
- Cut diagonally through both layers.
- Place RST and sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam, press.
- Set Row 1 aside.

## Sewing row 1

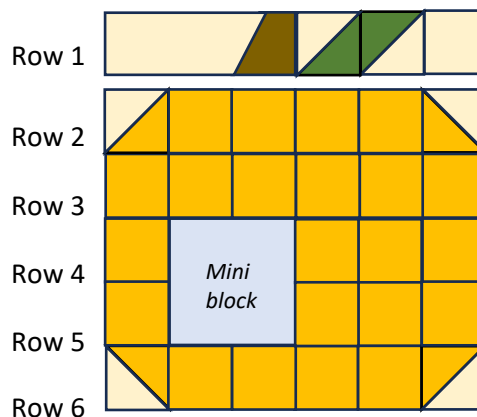


## Sewing the block:

- Layout Diagram 2 shows how to sew the shapes into larger rectangle units.
  - Sew units to the left and right of the mini block in Rows 4 and 5.
- Sew the Rows 2/3 unit to the Rows 4/5 unit.
- Sew Rows 2/5 unit to Row 6.
- Sew Row 1 to the top of the block. Note Row 1 is wider than the pumpkin so that the position of the stem has some "wiggle room".
- Block measures 12.5" x12.5" for a 12"x12" finish.

*Pro Tip: Row 1 is intentionally made larger than the other rows so that it can be placed above the pumpkin wherever you would like*
