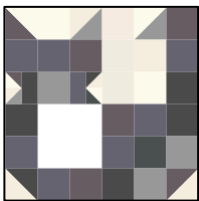
Week 8: Large Cat

Once again, a giant block has gobbled up a yummy mini block.....Gobble, gobble. The blocks become more intricate by combining a variety of sized of the rectangular shapes

Featured Techniques:

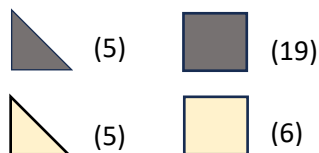
- Pattern reading skill building continues

Large Pumpkin



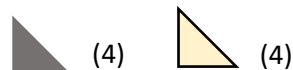
Precut shapes needed:

2 ½ inch squares and hsts

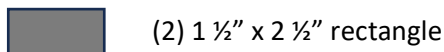


Precut shapes needed:

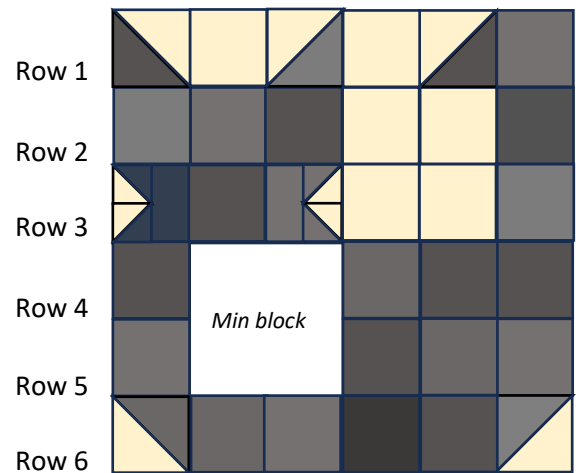
1 ½ inch squares and hsts



Additional cutting



(1) mini block of your choice



Large Cat layout diagram 1

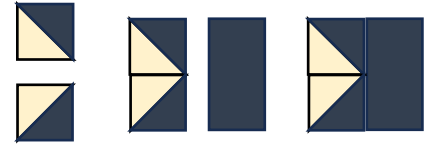
Pro Tip: Blocks are made from 2 ½ inch shapes and 1 ½ inch shapes. The block still measures 12 ½" unfinished

Pattern reading tip: Before turning the page, study row 3 of layout diagram 1. From the precut shapes used in the tutorial, how would you construct the row?

Quilt Along with QUILTERS SELECT.

Sewing the neck units:

- The neck units are located in row 3
- Each unit consists of (2) $1/12''$ hsts and (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 2 \frac{1}{2}''$ rectangle
- Use the diagram to the right to assemble the neck units
- Make 2

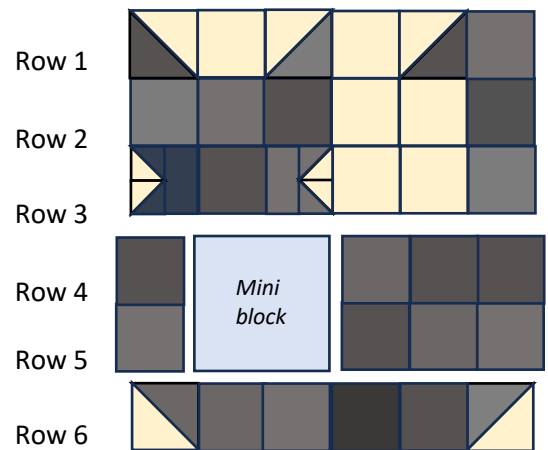


Neck unit assembly diagram

Pro Tip: Use the same fabric in the hsts that is used in the rectangle to create a more cohesive shape.

Sewing the block:

- Layout diagram 2 shows how to sew the shapes into larger rectangle units
- Sew rows 1, 2, and 3 together
- Sew the first shapes in rows 4 and 5 together into a 2-patch unit
- Sew the last 3 shapes in rows 4 and 5 together into a 6-patch unit
- Construct row 6 as usual
- Sew the 2-patch unit to the left of the mini block
- Sew the 6-patch unit to the right of the mini block
- Sew the rows together to complete the block
